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



#### Unite! as a EUniQ pilot

- EUniQ project put quality management on the agenda of Unite! from (almost) the start
- Principles and procedures of Unite! quality management are being defined
- The QA framework still is largely a guiding vision rather than established practice
- yet as such it continues to direct our transition from project to institutionalized alliance







## Unite! quality management: challenges and goals (1)

#### Multiple systems and regulations:

- Established QA systems at all universities
- Diverging national regulations

- Mutual trust: Representative use of existing QA systems for alliance
- Seek pathways through national regulations towards efficient QA standards and procedures




## Challenges and goals (2)

## Transition from a project to an institutionalized alliance:

- Coherent strategy
- Consistent implementation
- Systematic adaptation
- Establish quality cycles that link systematically strategy and activities
- Quality culture with focus on responsibility, inclusive participation and stakeholders involvement

#### Directions for the future

- 1. Obstacles from **national QA regulations** must be overcome.
- 2. Go beyond the **sectoral and project approaches** in European programmes, as we are building
  - > institutionalized alliances
  - that cover all missions of a university.
